East Syracuse, New York

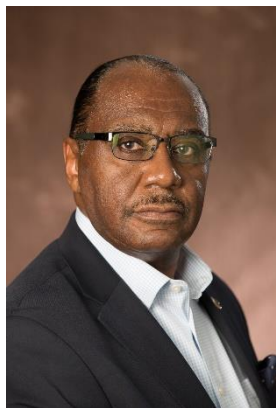

Chris is a partner in the law firm of Nixon Peabody LLP, where he holds and has held various leadership positions, including as a member for six years of the firm's board, a member since its inception of the firm's Pro Bono Committee, deputy head of the firm's Class Action Team, and head of the firm's Arbitration Team.
